

out of which Rs. 147.70 crore has been released by NABARD as loan waiver and recapitalization.

The second package is a Comprehensive package to provide cheap credit and subsidized yarn to all other handloom weavers and their cooperative societies. For easy credit availability to handloom weavers, the Government is providing Margin money assistance @ Rs. 4200 per weaver to individual weavers, their self help groups and joint liability groups, interest subvention of 3% per annum for 3 years and credit guarantee also for 3 years by the Credit Guarantee Fund Trust for Micro and Small Enterprises (CGTMSE). Till 30th November, 2012, 13,772 WCC have been issued, loan amounting to Rs. 49.15 Crore have been sanctioned and Rs. 22.8 crore has been disbursed. The Government will pay the required guarantee fee and annual services fee. For yarn at reasonable prices, the Government has approved 10% price subsidy on silk and cotton hank yarn. Under 10% price subsidy, till 30th November 2012 1,03,626 yarn pass book have been issued and yarn valuing Rs. 149.3 crore has been supplied. The Government has also enhanced the freight reimbursement under Mill Gate Price Scheme for transportation of different types of yarn used by the handloom sector in order to offset the increase in fuel cost, in order to ensure availability of subsidized yarn in the handloom clusters in far flung areas of the country.

THE MINISTER OF TEXTILES (SHRI ANAND SHARMA): (a) to (c) Government is implementing various schemes for the development/upgradation of textile workers *viz.* (i) Group Insurance Scheme to the powerloom workers (ii) Group Workshed Scheme (iii) Textile Workers Rehabilitation Fund Scheme (TWRFS) (iv) Integrated Skill Development Scheme (ISDS).

The funds released state-wise, scheme-wise under Group Workshed Scheme, Textile Workers Rehabilitation Fund Scheme during the last three years are given in

Statement-I (See below) and Group Insurance Scheme is given in Statement-II (See below). The state-wise amount released under Group Insurance scheme is not available.

Government is implementing Integrated Skill Development Scheme (ISDS) for upgradation of skills of textile workers in the country since July, 2010. Under the said scheme, Ministry of Textiles has approved training programmes for textile workers to be conducted at 14 Powerloom Service Centres (PSCs) of the Office of the Textile Commissioner. The fund allocated/released State-wise and PSC-wise under ISDS and details of targets or trainees and achievement is given in Statement-III

SHRI SANJAY RAUT:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme falls way short of the goals;

(b) whether it is a fact that recent UN reports have shown that under five child mortality rate in India is worse than even Nepal and Bangladesh; and

(c) if so, what effective steps Government is taking to spend heavily on health to check mortality rate in India?
